Welcome Angela!

Angela Yenssen is a part-time first year student in the Master of Divinity Program at Martin Luther University College. She works full-time as a staff lawyer at the Grey-Bruce Community Legal Clinic. The Legal Clinic is funded by Legal Aid Ontario to provide legal services to low income people in housing, social assistance, and non-union employment law. The Legal Clinic has also undertaken projects to support seniors and the local Indigenous First Nations. Angela's legal practice focuses on tenant rights and elder law.

Angela was a social worker for fourteen years prior to enrolling in law school. Angela worked primarily with older adults as a social worker. Angela went to law school because she was upset by the elder abuse situations she encountered and wanted to know how to use the law to prevent elder abuse. She worked for approximately one and a half years as a law student at the Office of the Public Guardian and Trustee to immerse herself in learning options to combat elder abuse. Angela currently chairs the Grey Bruce Elder Abuse Prevention Network.

Angela grew up on a farm on the Bruce County side of Grey County Road 10 outside of Neustadt. Angela lived in various places in Ontario as she pursued her university education and social work and legal careers. She was thrilled to return to Grey-Bruce as a staff lawyer at the Legal Clinic in March 2021. Angela currently lives in Owen Sound.






Sunday School

The next Sunday School dates are November 5, 19, December 3 and 17. On December 17, the kids will participate in the church service with Pastor Lori.


Sunday School resumes in the New Year on January 14, 2024.






Adult Bible Study

Friends,

Thank you for your prayers over the last two weeks for the unfolding crisis in Gaza. Today, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada and Canadian Lutheran World Relief are calling on Canadians to pray for those suffering and to give generously in response to this crisis.



We continue to grieve the senseless violence that sparked this war, but we can't wait to act. In Gaza, an unimaginable humanitarian catastrophe is getting worse by the hour. Over a million people have been forced to flee their homes in the last two weeks, and stocks of food, water, electricity, and medical supplies are desperately low. Hospitals have been badly damaged, leaving vulnerable populations such as pregnant women, infants, and the elderly at particular risk. Schools and places of worship have also been destroyed, including the oldest church in Gaza.

CLWR's mandate as a humanitarian organization is to provide life-saving aid wherever it's needed. Right now, that's in Gaza, where we're running out of time to save the lives of so many including children. But it's only possible with your help. CLWR has announced that it's joining other leading Canadian aid agencies in the Humanitarian Coalition in launching a joint appeal to provide emergency humanitarian relief in response to this growing crisis.

The stories you've read about struggles to get aid supplies through are real. We have long-standing partners in the region who want to help, but they need supplies. 
