

# **Kathy McBride**



Healthy sandwich lunches were free for anyone in the community who came, although donations were gratefully accepted. Our program was designed to meet the need of those who are hungry, but we quickly learned that the need for fellowship, conversation and someone to eat with was just as real.

Everyone who wanted a healthy meal and the company of friendly faces was welcome to come to our lunches. Our guests included those who are vulnerable in our community, hungry, precariously housed, as well as seniors and other community members. An average of 67 people attended each week. A total of 740 lunches were served throughout the 11 weeks.

A huge thank you goes out to the wonderful volunteers from St. Matthew's as well as from the community, who gave their time, their smiles and their love to make this program possible.







# **Collection of Creches**

In 2015, I was privileged to be part of the team that started the "Collection of Creches" display at St. Matthew's. The idea of presenting nativities to the public was not an original one. For a number of years, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in Walkerton held a display that I knew would be missed when they made the decision to discontinue having their display. So, the "Collection of Creches" was established. Our first display featured just over 100 nativities. In 2024, that number more than doubled. Over the years, we tried different ideas, but the only real focus was on the beautiful display of nativities.

This year, the LDS church will once again offer their tremendous display. The sheer numbers of nativities that they display provides the public with an unforgettable experience that leads up to the Advent Season in a dramatic way – one that focuses on the birth of Christ. The last year of their display, they shared over 3,000 nativities, making it the largest display of its kind in the world. For that reason, St. Matthew's will not be having the Collection of Creches this year. An announcement like this can't be made without thanking the many volunteers, who over the years helped plan the displays, decorated, catalogued incoming nativities, baked cookies when we offered refreshments, manned the elevator & amp; stair lift, hosted showings, were part of our live nativity, put up advertising posters, moved books from the library (and back in), played music (live and taped), packed up nativities, ensuring all were returned in good condition, and did so lovingly. Of course, what made this worthwhile was the people who came and experienced what St. Matthew's had to offer. So heartfelt thanks go to all of our guests over the years. Thank you all.

And do not be disappointed if you were hoping to share your own nativities again. They can become part of a much grander display. The LDS church is hoping to surpass their previous year's display and would love to include yours. You can take them to their church in Walkerton at 11 Fourth Street from November 2-5 th . #### What are the 10 possible signs of dementia?

#### Loss of initiative

Losing interest in spending time with friends and family and in taking part in activities. Needing prompts to become involved.

### Misplacing things

Putting things in strange places, like a remote in the refrigerator

#### Disorientation in time and place

Not knowing what day of the week it is or getting lost in a familiar place.

## Changes in mood, behaviour and personality

Experiencing severe mood changes or behaving out of character, such as being suspicious or withdrawing.

#### Difficulty doing familiar tasks

Forgetting how to do something you've been doing your whole life, such as preparing a meal or getting dressed

#### Problems with abstract thinking

Having difficulty managing finances or not knowing what numbers are and how they are used.

#### Impaired judgement

Not recognizing a medical problem that needs attention or wearing light clothing on a cold day.

#### Changes in language and communication

Forgetting words, substituting words or using the wrong words that don't fit the conversation.

#### Memory changes that affect day-to-day abilities

Forgetting who a family member is or not remembering new information.

#### Changes in sight or motion

Not seeing objects when walking or difficulty placing items on a table.


